Are you waiting for a child?

Where are the Children?

FCCA networks with agencies in the United States and abroad to help place their waiting children. Many children come from the California foster care system. Others come from developing countries such as Russia, China, Hong Kong, India, Korea, and others.

Children Waiting for Homes

Minority and mixed race children of all ages.

Sibling groups of two, three, or more, all ages.

Children who have been victims of neglect, abuse, and many moves.

Children, of every race, six years and up.

Children with medical challenges.

Infants to teens from developing countries.

A combination of the above.

The Adoption Process

Information Session: A free, informal meeting to provide general information about waiting children, the agency, and how to get started with a home study. Call your nearest office for the dates and times.

Adoption Preparation Class 1: A prerequisite to the homestudy, this is the first of four classes which prepare applicants for adoption. This is a relaxed session where applicants have a chance to ask questions about the homestudy process and basic adoption information.

Panel of Adoptive Parents: Adoptive couples share their experiences and information about their adoption. This may be combined with another session.

Intake Interview: The family meets with the interviewer and together they determine whether FCCA can help them find a child they would like to adopt. If so, the family will submit fingerprints, complete paperwork, and make arrangements to attend Adoption Preparation Classes 2, 3 and 4.

Adoption Preparation Classes 2 and 3: Education is the emphasis in these group sessions, which may include up to seven families.

Individual Interviews: Your social worker meets with each of you individually, at the agency office, during regular working hours.

Home Visit: The social worker will visit your home, at a time when all members of the household are present.

Adoption Preparation Class 4: Education is the emphasis in this group session, based on the Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI). This session will help demonstrate proven practical skills and strategies for applying the TBRI principles to everyday life.

Child Search and Placement: As you have been each step of the way, you are involved in the search for and placement of the child you will adopt.

Post-Placement and Finalizations: FCCA will complete the necessary visits and reports to help you finalize the adoption in court.

Who We Are

We are a fully licensed, private, non-profit Christian adoption agency providing adoption services for California families who wish to adopt waiting children. With six offices throughout California, we place waiting children of different races and ages, ranging from toddlers to teens. FCCA is a 501(c)(3) organization, COA Accredited for all Services, Hague-accredited by COA, #3139.
